Dear Lake Toxaway UMC family and friends,

All Saints Day actually falls on Sunday this year! John Wesley considered it one of the greatest celebrations in the life of the church. Wesley is quoted as saying in 1756, "how superstitious are they who scruple giving God solemn thanks for the lives and deaths of his saints!" I, like John Wesley, see this day as a great festival for the church.

I enjoy the remembrance of the saints of the church! It seems especially important to me to observe All Saints this year. In previous years, the communion ritual allowed for a time where we named the saints who had entered eternal life within the past year. Now, due to our fast from the Eucharist and the inability to have held normal memorial services, we need to take the opportunity to grieve together and to reclaim the hope of the Resurrection, even as we acknowledge the legacy that remains from our blessed saints of the Church.

All Saints Day is about acknowledging those who have died recently as well as those who have died throughout history. It allows us to acknowledge those who are no longer a part of this congregation but also those who are a part of the larger congregation of the body of Christ.

This day also provides an opportunity to remember the promises of eternity! It is a way of looking through all that is surrounding us now into a future that looks significantly different. It is not an escape! All Saints Day is a call to action, to live into this possible future, the kingdom of God, where, as the Scripture lessons remind us, "there is no hunger or thirst, and there is comfort for those who mourn and whose who suffer in the hands of God!" However, we envision this hope, it is a GRACE to cling to in uncertain times. We look toward the multitudes who have gone before as a promise and a beacon of light in our darkness. These are they who have gone before; let us celebrate them, even as we honor them by how we live.

Thanks be to God for them! Thanks be to God for their Resurrection in Christ! Thanks be to God for the ever-present comfort of the Holy Spirit as we grieve and live into the future! May we be found faithful by those who come behind us!

I loved each of these persons; they gave so many gifts to me and to us as a congregation. I love each of you. We are blessed to be in this ministry of following a Risen Lord in uncertain days! May we hold fast to Jesus!

Revelation 7:9-17

- 7:10 They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!"
- 7:11 And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God,
- 7:12 singing, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."
- 7:13 Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?"
- 7:14 I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.
- 7:15 For this reason, they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them.
- 7:16 They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat;
- 7:17 for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

Psalm 34:1-10, 22 (read responsively - text in bold)

- 34:1 I will bless the LORD at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth.
- 34:2 My soul makes its boast in the LORD; let the humble hear and be glad.
- 34:3 O magnify the LORD with me, and let us exalt his name together.
- 34:4 I sought the LORD, and he answered me, and delivered me from all my fears.
- Look to him, and be radiant; so, your faces shall never be ashamed.

- 3:1 See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him.
- 3:2 Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is.
- 3:3 And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

Matthew 5:1-12

- When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him.
- 5:2 Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:
- 5:3 "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- 5:4 "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- 5:5 "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.
