

Lake Toxarvay United Methodist Church Sunday, December 6th, 2020

Dear Lake Toxaway family and community,

Our youngest daughter, Emilee, has come home from NC State as her semester ended before Thanksgiving. Well...that is part of the story. She left again Thursday (12-3) to return to her apartment off campus because she has a project to do. She is the president of The Raleigh Wesley Foundation, the United Methodist Student ministry for NC State and the other colleges in the Raleigh area. This group has worked hard to be in ministry and to gather in small discipleship groups of 10 or less in order to meet guidelines of the pandemic. The RWF meets in a building on the campus of a Methodist Church; the building is referred to as The Hut.

Our daughter, Emilee, likes things to be clean and organized, so she had arranged a cleanup and paint day for the large common room in August. Now, she has arranged a cleanup weekend "to attack" one of the break-out rooms and the kitchen in the Hut. It has been one thing for her to notice there was "work" to be done. It is quite another one to determine you are the one who needs to organize, to recruit others, and do the work.

I think this story about Emilee is appropriate for this second week of Advent. I think we are all members of a clean-up crew to make ready, to prepare. I am appreciative to the Worship Committee and some other individuals who have prepared the sanctuary and the grounds of our church for the celebration of Advent and the birth of Christ. It makes our church look ready for the coming of Christ! I responded in a playful way to a picture of some of these individuals among the nativity out front and asked who were the Wise Men, Shepherds, and Angels.

I am issuing an invitation to you to join the clean-up crew and the road crew (John the Baptist calls out to make the paths straight from the reading in Mark's Gospel). May we see the big picture form the prophet Isaiah. God heard the cry of His people and now comes with a response! God has listened and now speaks, and the word God speaks is Jesus! The first hearers of Isaiah heard these words in the context of coming home, of leaving exile and returning to Israel. And God does bring them home - not necessarily to the home they envisioned, but to the home God envisions, the community God creates. This is the home we seek, all of us. And we find this home in Jesus, the child in the manger, the Savior on the cross. Home is where we are loved and healed and heard!

The glory of Christmas is that while there is a silent night, there is a need to listen and to shut out the distancing noise of the world and our brokenness; it is fundamentally a dialog. The Lord's highway is a two-way street. Our call is to listen and to respond: to announce, to proclaim, to make way. "Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, ... do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "here is you God!"

Company's coming, y'all! We need to be ready. Join the clean-up and the road crew. May we be ready for the One who comes to lead us home! The joy is we get to be a part of the clean up crew. May we work together in our community as we try to find ways to worship and celebrate and invite. And this clean-up and road crew has to be creative as we pray and think about ways to include our community in worship of the Savior of the World when we cannot observe the familiar ways. May God guide us to find our way home and lead others to home even as we live in a time of many challenges.

I love you and gladly serve on the clean-up and road crew with you!

Lighting the Advent Wreath

Reader #1: "A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

Reader #2: Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." (Isaiah 40:3-5) (Light one blue candle.)

Reader #1: We light the first Advent candle as a symbol of our hope that God will surely come.

Reader #2: In the midst of chaos, in the face of adversity, in the rocky and desolate places, the Prince of Peace will make a path that is straight and sure. May we follow in the way of God to bring peace to all the people of the world. Together, we light the second Advent candle as a symbol of the peace which comes to us in the way of Christ. (light a second blue candle)

Let us pray:

Holy God, there is much that gets in the way of our ability to see you coming. We are burdened and distracted by many things. We carry loads that weigh us down.

We are weary and broken. But our hearts long for you.

Help us to lift our eyes to see you. Help us to clear the rubble to make way for you to enter.

Take away the clutter so that we may be free to see you. Amen.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Isaiah 40:1-11

- 40:1 Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God.
- 40:2 Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins.
- 40:3 A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.
- 40:4 Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.
- Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

- 40:10 See, the Lord GOD comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him.
- 40:11 He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

Psalm 85:1-2, 8-13 (please read responsively the text in bold)

- 85:1 LORD, you were favorable to your land; you restored the fortunes of Jacob.
- 85:2 You forgave the iniquity of your people; you pardoned all their sin. Selah
- Let me hear what God the LORD will speak, for he will speak peace to his people, to his faithful, to those who turn to him in their hearts.
- 85:9 Surely his salvation is at hand for those who fear him, that his glory may dwell in our land.
- 85:10 Steadfast love and faithfulness will meet; righteousness and peace will kiss each other.
- 85:11 Faithfulness will spring up from the ground, and righteousness will look down from the sky.
- 85:12 The LORD will give what is good, and our land will yield its increase.
- 85:13 Righteousness will go before him, and will make a path for his steps.

2 Peter 3:8-15a

- 3:8 But do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day.
- 3:9 The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance.
- 3:10 But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.
- 3:11 Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness,
- waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire?

- 3:13 But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home.
- 3:14 Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish;
- 3:15a and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation. So also our beloved brother Paul wrote to you according to the wisdom given him.

Mark 1:1-8 (Please Stand)

- 1:1 The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.
- 1:2 As it is written in the prophet Isaiah, "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way;
- the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,'"
- 1:4 John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.
- 1:5 And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.
- 1:6 Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey.
- 1:7 He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals.
- 1:8 I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
- L: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

P: Thanks be to God!
