Dear Lake Toxaway UMC Family and Community,

Kim and I went away this week to celebrate our anniversary and to recharge. We are staying in a quiet place; the lack of noise has invited me to contemplate the beauty of silence and my need for planned silence. I also have contemplated rest and a ceasing activity routine; I have been re-reading passages of scripture from Genesis from a newly purchased study Bible.

A significant theological concept and practice lacking in my life is Sabbath keeping which would include silence and listening. The sabbath is a day to worship God and to cease normal activities and to rest. If God rested, we humans need to rest also. I am not suggesting a strict adherence to a "no work, no play" routine. I simply state my recognition for a routine that varies from other days in my week; a time to worship God and to allow my body, mind and, most importantly, my spirit to have a time to cease activity and to rest.

Naps have provided welcome restoration. Watching sunsets and sunrises, giving attention to the phase of the moon and the stars in the sky, feeling gentle breezes across a marsh as water encroaches and then recedes also have provided a restored alertness. Taking the time to write in my journal with less hurriedness has allowed me an attentiveness to the Holy Spirit and his direction in my life and in the life of our church.

I welcome Rev. Kerry Purselle as our worship leader today. She has been a good friend to our family; she is a faithful proclaimer of the Gospel. Please surround her in the Christian hospitality I have preached recently; it is not easy to preach to an empty congregation and trust people are worshipping at home!

I have followed the lectionary texts this week. I have been drawn to Paul's words: "Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law." I owe a great deal of love to all of you, but it is not out of obligation. I owe love to you because I experience the mutuality of God's love in this church community. I want to share a prayer with you from a devotional, <u>Passing Thoughts</u>, by Gilbert Bowen that I read this week:

Eternal love, out of the confidence that I am loved with the One Love that finally counts, lift from me now preoccupation with whether others love me. May I give myself to care and concern for those with whom I shall share the day, at work and at play, both in their pain and joy. May I know the life where my own needs are fulfilled beyond all measure, the life of meaning and joy. Amen.

I look forward to my return to you. I pray we all experience renewal in our cycle of Sabbath keeping to which I am going to recommit. I also pray we all owe no one anything, except to love one another!

Opening Prayer

Call to our mind the good feeling when we are comfortable with a loved one; the excitement when we look forward to being with friends or family; the richness of watching children grow and mature; the full heart experienced when a child says, "I love you grandpa." The list is longer than we can finish. We have enough and more for there to be joy and praise in our hearts. Let it be, dear Lord.

We do not desire to gloss over the pain and hurt which is a part of life. We know persons who are bowed down with heavy responsibilities; persons who are trying to gather the pieces of broken relationships; persons who wonder what it would be like to feel healthy again; persons who both accept and struggle against physical limitations. By your Spirit, Lord, when any of us are confused or in pain, we are able to live in strength and courage if, in faith, we remember to ask for help. Let it be so for all who need you. Let some sense of blessing touch each one who joins in this prayer. And in return, you shall hear in our hearts a song of praise and joy in worship this day. Through Christ we pray, Amen.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Exodus 12:1-14

- 12:1 The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt:
- 12:2 This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you.
- 12:3 Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household.
- 12:4 If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it.
- 12:5 Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year-old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats.
- 12:6 You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight.
- 12:7 They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it.
- 12:8 They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs.
- 12:9 Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs.
- 12:10 You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn.

- 12:11 This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the LORD.
- 12:12 For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD.
- 12:13 The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.
- 12:14 This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

Psalm 149 (read responsively)

- 149:1 Praise the LORD! Sing to the LORD a new song, his praise in the assembly of the faithful.
- 149:2 Let Israel be glad in its Maker; let the children of Zion rejoice in their King.
- 149:3 Let them praise his name with dancing, making melody to him with tambourine and lyre.
- 149:4 For the LORD takes pleasure in his people; he adorns the humble with victory.
- 149:5 Let the faithful exult in glory; let them sing for joy on their couches.
- 149:6 Let the high praises of God be in their throats and two-edged swords in their hands,
- 149:7 to execute vengeance on the nations and punishment on the peoples,
- 149:8 to bind their kings with fetters and their nobles with chains of iron,
- 149:9 to execute on them the judgment decreed. This is glory for all his faithful ones.

Romans 13:8-14

- 13:8 Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law.
- The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet"; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbor as yourself."
- 13:10 Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.
- 13:11 Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers;
- the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light;
- 13:13 let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy.
- 13:14 Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

Matthew 18:15-20

- 18:15 "If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one.
- 18:16 But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses.
- 18:17 If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector.
- 18:18 Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.
- 18:19 Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven.
- 18:20 For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."
- L: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

P: Thanks be to God!
