

Lake Toxarvay United Methodist Church Sunday, February 21st, 2021

Dear Lake Toxaway family and friends,

Lent began on Ash Wednesday this past week. I am aware that many of you will become aware of this season today. You will experience the beginning of Lent today. I wanted to remind you that the devotionals written by you and our church family are posted on the church's website, laketwoxawayumc.org and can be accessed by clicking on the calendar on the home page. I am reading these devotionals for the first time each day and the first 3 devotionals have moved me. I encourage you to participate in this discipline and also pick up your Bible and read it daily and pray. I hope some of you might add to your devotional practices by trying to write in a journal every day and record how God has been at work in your life that day or the previous day.

The readings for this Sunday from Genesis, 1 Peter and Mark are about relationship and about presence. On Ash Wednesday, we were admonished to "rend our hearts" as we began a holy fast (from the Prophet Joel). There is a corporate call to the Lenten journey. We heard the words from Joel "to bring the whole community together;" no excuses allowed. We are together in this act of rending, of opening ourselves as a whole body to the promise of God. But the promise is singular, and that promise is God will be in relationship with us.

Of course, there are lots of promises in the Bible. I know this fact; however, there are a variety of gifts and encouragements which all stem from the singular promise of presence. "Best of all, God is with us," as John Wesley reportedly said on his deathbed. We can and should enumerate some of these manifestations of the promise of presence throughout our lives. I have found the first three devotionals written by members of our church community at the beginning of Lent to be about God's presence in their lives. God is with us; we are not alone!

The story of Noah and the Ark and the symbol of the rainbow are well known throughout the history of the Judeo-Christian faith. The rainbow is a symbol of promise, acceptance, and hope. This symbol gathers us together, "all who have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23)."

Our worship declares not only "there is a sign as we point beyond ourselves to the naturally occurring light refracting through the rain and producing an arc of color and light; but because of that sign and because of that promise, now we are the sign. The church has become the rainbow sign of the presence of God as we seek to gather up the scattered beloved of God into one covenantal community of faith. May God use us at Lake Toxaway UMC as the sign!

Ironically, I am pushing us to get physical signs along the roads in our community to point people to our building. I am encouraging you to share your devotionals with your friends and neighbors in the belief we are signs of the promise and presence of God at work in the world today. We live under the direction of the Holy Spirit, redeemed by Jesus, and loved by God, the Father.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Genesis 9:8-17

- 9:8 God said to Noah and to his sons with him,
- 9:9 "As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you,
- 9:10 and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark.
- 9:11 I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth."
- 9:12 God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations:
- 9:13 I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth.
- 9:14 When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds,
- 9:15 I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh.
- 9:16 When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth."
- 9:17 God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth."

Psalm 25:1-10 (Please read the bold text)

- 25:1 To you, O LORD, I lift up my soul.
- O my God, in you I trust; do not let me be put to shame; do not let my enemies exult over me.
- Do not let those who wait for you be put to shame; let them be ashamed who are wantonly treacherous.
- 25:4 Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths.
- Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all day long.
- 25:6 Be mindful of your mercy, O LORD, and of your steadfast love, for they have been from of old.
- Do not remember the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to your steadfast love remember me, for your goodness' sake, O LORD!
- 25:8 Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in the way.
- 25:9 He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way.
- 25:10 All the paths of the LORD are steadfast love and faithfulness, for those who keep his covenant and his decrees.

1 Peter 3:18-22

- 3:18 For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit,
- 3:19 in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison
- 3:20 who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water.
- 3:21 And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you--not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ,
- who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

Mark 1:9-15 (Please stand for the Gospel)

- 1:9 In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan.
- 1:10 And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him.
- 1:11 And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."
- 1:12 And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness.
- He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him.
- 1:14 Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God,
- 1:15 and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."

L: This is the word of the Lord for the people of Christ.

P: Thanks be to God.
