Dear Lake Toxaway family and friends,

I confess to you today (Fríday, Apríl 16), I have no clue as to where the Holy Spírít will lead me in the sermon. I usually have started a sermon on Fríday morning, so when I write the pastoral letter, I have some idea as to how to connect this letter with the upcoming Sunday. Today and this week, I have sat in my chair for a few hours with little inspiration.

The Epistle lesson is speaking clearly to me this morning, however: "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now: what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is (1 John 3: 1-7)."

The three letters of John in the New Testament likely are written by a pastor serving a church or churches who were struggling with love and God. The basic biblical Christian conviction is the two subjects are related intricately. If we want to love others as God intends, we need to understand and receive the love God has given us and remember we, by the grace of Jesus, are made children of God!

In our Wesleyan theology, we boldly move to claim "we will be like him." One of the Wesleyan tenets of faith is a doctrine of perfection (a holiness or sanctification understanding of grace). As Christians, we do not believe we obtain perfection; however, as God's children living in study of the Word and in community with other Christians, we grow and become more Christ-like every day, week, month, and year. This is a standard we believe God intends for us and that this ongoing transformation is the Work of the Holy Spirit in us. We have no room to boast about it; it is the work of God. If we are becoming more like Christ, we find ourselves loving others more fully and completely. We drop our human tendency to judge and take on a passionate desire to assist others in finding and claiming the love the Father offers to them. I find the Gospel stories of Jesus' resurrection so fascinating as I contemplate God's immense love and patience with the disciples and us. Luke likely is describing the same story we read from John's Gospel last week. The detail of a locked door or an absent Thomas are not present. We pick this story up after Jesus has appeared to two individuals returning from Jerusalem on the road to Emmaus. These individuals had arrived in their village and invited Jesus to stay with them for the evening. They had talked for the day with Jesus and only recognized him as he sat down at the table and broke the bread. Then Jesus disappeared, but these two individuals returned to Jerusalem to tell the disciples and as they were sharing their experience with the Risen Christ, Jesus appears among them.

I thínk thís is the way we share the Gospel. We tell how the Risen Christ has appeared to us. As we tell our story and experience of Christ, Jesus appears to others and begins his work of redemption, transformation, and sanctification! We find joy even in our "disbelieving and wondering" and continue as witnesses of these things.

I am praying you are experiencing Easter joy, surprise, shock, hope, love! We are gifted with a God who loved us so much he sent his only Son, Jesus, to give us eternal life. Our call is to action. I sometimes want to spend time basking in this glorious gift and this is an important part of loving God. As I continue my journey of faith, I am realizing we can simultaneously bask in God's love as we give witness to God's love for others. This is what the pastor, John, was inviting his congregation to do.

May we live in the love of God and share the love of God with others. The two are intricately related; we do not have to figure out this connection. We live it!

I am thankful to serve among you and to grow in Christ with you! We are the Easter people. May Christ's resurrection continue to bring us more fully into the image of Christ.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

*Acts 3:12-19

* During Eastertide a reading from Acts is often substituted for the lesson from the Hebrew Bible.

- 3:12 When Peter saw it, he addressed the people, "You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk?
- 3:13 The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him.
- 3:14 But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you,
- 3:15 and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses.
- 3:16 And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you.
- 3:17 "And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers.
- 3:18 In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer.
- 3:19 Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out,

Psalm 4 (Please read responsively the bold text.)

- 4:1 Answer me when I call, O God of my right! You gave me room when I was in distress. Be gracious to me, and hear my prayer.
- 4:2 How long, you people, shall my honor suffer shame? How long will you love vain words, and seek after lies? Selah
- 4:3 But know that the LORD has set apart the faithful for himself; the LORD hears when I call to him.
- 4:4 When you are disturbed, do not sin; ponder it on your beds, and be silent. Selah
- 4:5 Offer right sacrifices, and put your trust in the LORD.
- 4:6 There are many who say, "O that we might see some good! Let the light of your face shine on us, O LORD!"
- 4:7 You have put gladness in my heart more than when their grain and wine abound.
- 4:8 I will both lie down and sleep in peace; for you alone, O LORD, make me lie down in safety.

<u>1 John 3:1-7</u>

- 3:1 See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him.
- 3:2 Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is.
- 3:3 And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.
- 3:4 Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness.
- 3:5 You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin.
- 3:6 No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him.
- 3:7 Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

Luke 24:36b-48 (Please stand for the Gospel reading.)

- 24:36b While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."
- 24:37 They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost.
- 24:38 He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts?
- 24:39 Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have."
- 24:40 And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet.
- 24:41 While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?"
- 24:42 They gave him a piece of broiled fish,
- 24:43 and he took it and ate in their presence.
- 24:44 Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you--that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled."
- 24:45 Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures,
- 24:46 and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day,
- 24:47 and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem.
- 24:48 You are witnesses of these things.

L: This is the word of the Lord for the people of Christ. P: Thanks be to God.
