#### Dear Lake Toxaway family and friends,

It is Mother's Day today in the United States. One of the forgotten facts about Mother's Day is that the card companies did not create this day. A Methodist laywoman, Anna Jarvis, organized the first official celebration at a Methodist church in Grafton, West Virginia after her own mother's death; The date for the first celebration was May 10, 1908. Ms. Jarvis never married or had children. She did obtain financial backing from a Philadelphia department store owner, John Wanamaker. The day became commercialized because of this joint venture but Ann Jarvis had conceived the idea as a day of personal celebrations between mothers and families. Her idea was to suggest individuals wear a carnation and attend their mother's church. As the day became increasing commercialized, Anna Jarvis went on a campaign to attempt to reclaim her original vision for this holiday.

The mother of Anna Jarvis, Ann Reeves Jarvis, had worked in West Virginia prior to the Civil War to start "Mothers' Day Work Clubs." These clubs organized meetings with the intention of teaching women how to properly care for their children and to receive support from more experienced women in the challenges of motherhood.

I usually would never take this much time to talk about a secular holiday, but I think it is important to connect Mother's Day and its celebration to the Christian Church! I also recognize this day is bittersweet and painful for many of us. While some of us had mothers, who worked tirelessly to organize the family, nurture and love unconditionally often while sacrificing tremendously, others of us had mothers who were unable to care for us or who left the family early because of death or emotional challenges. I also know many women who wanted children but were not granted their heart's desire. For these reasons and many more, I always recognize the delicate and difficult commemoration of this day. I never want to ignore the many whose experience of mother was more painful than joyous. I never want to ignore those mothers whose children have died prematurely or "out of order." I never want to ignore those who wanted to have children whose life circumstances prevented this desire. I also never want to ignore those who made conscious decisions not to be a mother and follow other pathways.

I do not want to ignore Mother's Day, however. I want to acknowledge this day and connect it to a theological truth in our scripture lessons for today. We are followers of Christ and everything our culture does should be observed from a theological point of view. Jesus said: "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12). This is an ongoing, new every morning "kind of thing." This is not a love your enemies "kind of thing" but love those around you, those in your care. This is the kind of love a parent should give.

In my experience, my mother could not love me in this way. Her mental illness prevented her from such love. I prayed many times for God to grant healing to her and enable her to love me unconditionally. As I have matured, I have recognized the many good things my mother taught me; the most important gift was her unwavering faith in God and a trust God would provide what she could not provide. She did her best, and that is all any of us can do. Do our best to love.

Loving is who we are: loving in a way that lays down our lives for those we love, loving in a way that honors God and the commandments of God, loving that is a response to the love we have received from God in Christ, loving that trusts God to provide the love we need. Loving another is a response to the love we have received. And all of us have been loved by God in His definitive sacrificial act of loving. So may our response be to love more and with greater love. We are filled with love because of God's love for us!

Remember God's love surrounds all of us on this Mother's Day.

# SCRIPTURE READINGS

- 10:45 The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles,
- 10:46 for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said,
- 10:47 "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?"
- 10:48 So, he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

#### Psalm 98 (Please read responsively the bold text)

- 98:1 O sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things. His right hand and his holy arm have gotten him victory.
- 98:2 The LORD has made known his victory; he has revealed his vindication in the sight of the nations.
- 98:3 He has remembered his steadfast love and faithfulness to the house of Israel. All the ends of the earth have seen the victory of our God.
- 98:4 Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises.

- 5:3 For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome,
- 5:4 for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith.

- 5:5 Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?
- 5:6 This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

#### John 15:9-17 (Please stand for the Gospel)

- 15:9 As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love.
- 15:10 If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love.
- 15:11 I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.
- 15:12 "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.
- 15:13 No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.
- 15:14 You are my friends if you do what I command you.
- 15:15 I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father.
- 15:16 You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name.
- 15:17 I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.


